


PROGRAM EVALUATION

Evaluation is a process that involves collecting and analyzing information about a program's activities, characteristics, and outcomes. Its purpose is to make judgements about a program, to improve its effectiveness, and/or inform programming decisions.



WHY IS EVALUATION IMPORTANT?

- More support for GSA programs
 - Funding
 - Community
 - Political
- Helps you see that you are meeting program goals



HOW DO YOU START?

You can start by checking to see if your goals meet the **SMART** rubric





• <u>Measurable</u>: How will you demonstrate and evaluate the extent to which the goal has been met?

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- Achievable: stretch and challenging goals within ability to achieve outcome. What is the action-oriented verb?
- <u>Relevant</u>: How does the goal tie into your key responsibilities? How is it aligned to objectives?
- <u>Time-bound</u>: Set 1 or more target dates, the "by when" to guide your goal to successful and timely completion (include deadlines, dates and frequency)
